Risk Checklist: Gurdwara Re-opening

Introduction

This document provides a checklist for the Gurdwara to assess measures to be put in place to reduce the risk from COVID-19 to both members of the Sangat (congregation) and Gurdwara Sevadaars (volunteers).

How COVID-19 is spread

The spread of COVID-19 is most likely to happen when there is close contact (2 metres or less) with an infected person. It is likely that the risk increases the longer someone has close contact with an infected person.

Droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes or speaks, containing the virus are the main means of transmission.

There are two main routes by which people can spread COVID-19:

- Infection can be spread to people who are nearby (within 2 metres) such that droplets could be inhaled.
- It is also possible that someone may become infected by touching a surface, object or the hand of an infected person that has been contaminated with respiratory secretions and then touching their own mouth, nose, or eyes (such as touching door knob or shaking hands then touching own face).

How long the virus can survive


How long any respiratory virus survives will depend on a number of factors, including, what surface the virus is on and exposure to cleaning products

Under most circumstances, the amount of infectious virus on any contaminated surfaces is likely to **decrease significantly over 72 hours**.


